a. PD 2020-116 – Parks Capital Improvements Program – Proposed 2021 Projects (6:18 p.m.)

Hannon provided an update on current Park projects with several photos and reviewed the 2021-2026 CIP (Capital Improvement Plan). Commissioners reviewed current 2020 projects and the proposed projects for the CIP. The tennis court resurfacing project planned for 2020 at Silver Lake Recreation Area was not expected to be completed this year so the Commission decided to move the project to 2021.

Bukowski moved and Remy seconded to RECOMMEND to the Township Board the list of priority Parks and Recreation projects for 2021 including removing the old tennis courts and site cleanup at Boardman Valley Nature Preserve, the Master Park Design Plan at Grand Traverse Commons Natural Area, the site improvements and gravel parking lot at River East Recreation Area, and the tennis court resurfacing at Silver Lake Recreation Area for a total of \$150,000.

STATE OF MICHIGAN 100TH LEGISLATURE REGULAR SESSION OF 2020

Introduced by Senator Schmidt

ENROLLED SENATE BILL No. 595

AN ACT to authorize the state administrative board to accept and convey real property in Grand Traverse County; to prescribe conditions for the conveyance; and to provide for disposition of the revenue from the conveyance.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Sec. 1. (1) The state administrative board, on behalf of this state, subject to and contingent on the conveyance of the property to the Charter Township of Garfield, Grand Traverse County, as provided in subsection (2), may accept from the Charter Township of Garfield, for consideration of \$1.00, real property that was originally conveyed, in accordance with 1993 PA 38, by a December 14, 1993 quitclaim deed that is recorded in Liber 0984 page 304, Grand Traverse County records. The property is located in Grand Traverse County, Michigan and more particularly described as:

Parcel RR: Part of the Northwest fractional 1/4 and part of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 9, Town 27 North, Range 11 West, Garfield Township, Grand Traverse County, Michigan more fully described as beginning at the West 1/4 corner of said Section 9; thence along the West Line of said section North 00 degrees 54 minutes 19 seconds East 962.96 feet to a point South 00 degrees 54 minutes 19 seconds West 300.00 feet from the centerline of County Road No. 610 (Long Lake Road); thence East 1,613.66 feet; thence South 36 degrees 46 minutes 38 seconds East 1,137.45 feet to the Northwest corner of the Arnell Engstrom property as recorded in Liber 0917, Page 221; thence along the West line of said parcel South 01 degrees 26 minutes 02 seconds East 687.03 feet; thence South 68 degrees 11 minutes 47 seconds West 1,816.48 feet to the Northeast corner of the West 1/2 of the Southwest 1/4 of said Southwest 1/4 of Section 9; thence along the South 1/8 line of said section South 89 degrees 36 minutes 42 seconds West 659.34 feet to the West line of said section; thence along said West Line North 00 degrees 49 minutes 09 seconds East 1,314.34 feet to the Point of Beginning, containing 100.87 acres of land more or less.

- (2) The state administrative board, on behalf of this state, after receiving the conveyance authorized in subsection (1), shall convey the property to the Charter Township of Garfield, for consideration of \$1.00.
- (3) The description of the property in subsection (1) is approximate and for purposes of the conveyances is subject to adjustment as the state administrative board or attorney general considers necessary by survey or other legal description.

- (4) Any conveyance of property under subsection (2) must not contain any restriction, as required by section 3(10) of 1993 PA 38, relating to a memorandum of agreement between the department of management and budget, now the department of technology, management, and budget, and the Grand Traverse Commons Redevelopment Corporation. However, the conveyance must contain any other restrictions required by 1993 PA 38 and all of the following restrictions:
 - (a) That the land must be used solely and exclusively for nonmotorized public purposes.
- (b) That if a fee, term, or condition is imposed on members of the public for use of the property, or if such a fee, term, or condition is waived, all members of the public must be subject to the same fees, terms, conditions, and waivers.
 - (c) That changes to the property must not exacerbate any known or unknown contaminated soils.
- (5) If property conveyed under this act is used in a manner that violates any of the restrictions imposed under subsection (4), this state may reenter and take the property, terminating the grantee's or any successor's estate in the property. An action to regain possession of the property may be brought and maintained by the attorney general on behalf of this state.
- (6) If this state reenters and repossesses property under subsection (5), this state is not liable to reimburse any person for any improvements made on the property or to compensate any person for any part of an unfulfilled contract or license issued to provide goods or services on or for the property.
- (7) The state administrative board shall make the conveyance authorized by subsection (2) by quitclaim deed or other instrument approved by the attorney general.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.

CPO's moved along campers near Templeton Barn.

Working on getting signs posted for the northern boundary.

Walk through scheduled with CPO's to make sure the camps have moved we previously had contact with.

Boardman Valley

Met with contractors for tennis court transformation to parking lot. Received estimates from Elmer's & Molon. Still waiting on

potentially two more bids. Two other contractors do not wish to bid.

Boardwalk Extension with Youth Works (~100 feet) proposed for the wet area south of crushed gravel trail. Secure boardwalk material that was left over from previous projects.

Miller Creek

Contact with Liv Arbors about tobacco use from their residents on the Parks/Township Line.

Identified some boardwalk repairs that need to happen this Fall or Early Spring.

Kid's Creek

Conservation District cleaned up banks at pond.

Identified Area where bio-controls of purple loosestrife can be used in the Spring.

District pulled aquatic weeds in pond.

Site Restoration is holding firm at Mill Demo Location.

Meetings with Planning/Conservation District working on Draft Agreement for budgeting towards 2021.

BACKGROUND:

The old tennis courts at Boardman Valley Nature Preserve are in a state of disrepair, including cracks in the surface and trees and shrubs growing through the fence. Also, the water table is very high in this area which provides long-term maintenance challenges.

In speaking with a few engineers, it appears that the most cost-effective way to improve the site would be to crack fill, seal, and topcoat with asphalt for additional parking. In doing so, this would alleviate some of the stress of the existing small parking lot for the pickleball courts, the YMCA, Kid's Club, and other recreational users of the park. A small crushed gravel entrance would be installed between the existing parking lot and the newly renovated parking lot. The fence around the courts would be removed and the area would gain approximately 30 new parking spaces.

With the scope of work and availability of sub-contractors, only Molon & Elmer's are willing to fit this project in this fall. As Molon has provided the lowest bid, it is suggested that the Parks and Recreation Commission consider recommending to the Township Board to move forward on this project with Molon.

This project was originally identified to be completed in 2021 as part of the Parks Capital Improvements Program for 2021. Furthermore, one project identified for 2020, the well house at Silver Lake Recreation Area, will likely need to be delayed to 2021 due to difficulty of finding contractors for this type of work. It is suggested that the Parks and Recreation Commission consider recommending an amended Parks CIP for 2021 to the Township Board to account for swapping these two projects, among any other changes.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Following discussion, if the Parks and Recreation Board is comfortable with the Molon's estimate, then the following motion is suggested:

MOTION TO RECOMMEND to the Township Board to accept the bid from Molon for a project at Boardman Valley Nature preserve to replace the existing old tennis courts with an additional parking lot area.

BACKGROUND:

At the August 10 Parks and Recreation Commission meeting, the Commissioners recommended a list of priority projects for 2021 to the Township Board as part of the discussion for the overall Township budget for 2021, as follows:

River East Recreation Area	General site improvements / parking area	\$75,000
Grand Traverse Commons	Master Park Design Plan	\$50,000
Boardman Valley Nature Preserve	Remove old tennis courts / site cleanup	\$20,000
Silver Lake Recreation Area	Tennis court resurfacing (carry over from 2020)	\$5,000

The Parks and Recreation Commission should consider some new information to potentially amend the proposed list of 2021 priority projects, as follows:

- The removal of the tennis courts at Boardman Valley Nature Preserve was originally proposed for 2021 but this project could potentially be completed in 2020. Also, the well house construction at Silver Lake Recreation Area was proposed for 2020 but may need to be delayed to 2021.
- Grand Traverse Conservation District has recommended the installation of a solar aeration system
 for Olesen Pond at Kids Creek Park to improve water quality of the pond. Commissioners should
 consider the benefits and impacts of this proposed project, including future maintenance for this
 system should it be installed.
- After an internal initial review and feedback on the proposed project list, and given the desire to maintain a similar parks budget in 2021 as in 2020 for both projects and maintenance, the Parks and Recreation Commission should consider recommending an amount for projects in 2021 in the same range as the amount in 2020, which was \$135,000. This may be accomplished by reducing the scope of the project at River East Recreation Area. Also, the 2021 list includes some projects which were budgeted for 2020 and will carry over to 2021.
