#### 6. Reports

#### a. Construction Report (6:10)

Jennifer Hodges with Gourdie Fraser included a written report in the packets and said everything is status quo. She met with representatives from DM Tanks and the Cass Road drainage district is 75% complete in design.

## b. Sheriff's Department Report (6:14)

Deputy Chris Barsheff with the Sheriff's Department said that in June, Garfield Township had 41% of the caseload in the county. He added that non-criminal complaints went up by 43 from the previous month and a retail fraud blitz resulted in five arrests. The Sherriff's department took part in the Cherry Festival bike rodeo. Because of complaints regarding speeds on Silver Lake and Barney Roads, speed signs have identified when an officer should be present. Bike patrols happen regularly and a cookout will be held for Carson Square residents.

#### c. GT Metro Fire Report (6:22)

Lt. Steve Apostle reported that there has been an increase in car crashes needing extrication and mentioned some of the highlights on his written report. Blood Law asked about a number for lift assists and next month, he will provide those stats.

#### e. County Commissioner's Report (6:31)

Commissioner Cheryl Gore Follett said they will meet tomorrow night regarding a lease on the PACE building. An offer has been made for the County Administrator position, but a 5 year old felony for which the person was acquitted may cause a problem.

#### f. Treasurer's Report (6:37)

Blood Law reviewed the Treasurer's Report and pointed out transfers to the board. She said that state revenue sharing last guarter increased by 4%.

## g. Clerk's Report (6:39)

McManus said that she and the Deputy Clerk attended a MTA Clerk's retreat and obtained lots of good information. On August 5th and 6th there is a trustees MTA retreat and board members can pick up brochures from her if they are interested in attending.

#### h. Supervisor's Report (6:42)

Korn reported that he has two out of three proposals on the audio/visual system in the meeting room and when he receives the third proposal he will call a meeting of the Building Committee to make a recommendation to the Board. He received a timeline from DM tanks and the new water tank should be up and running in October, but depending on the weather, it may not be painted. He also met John DiVosso and a consultant on a water rate study since the City is raising its water costs. The Township may be switching to a ready to serve option where residents will be charged for the water they use.

#### 7. Unfinished Business

### a. Ridgeview Road

Board members revisited the matter of a Ridgeview Road SAD. They agreed that there is a policy in place to get an SAD started and they want to ensure that residents are in agreement about the road before and money is spent for an estimate or engineering costs. Korn said the initial estimate would cost \$1,000. Board members were worried that a precedent may be set in this case because many others with bad roads were not given an option to fix their roads. The Township Ethics committee is meeting and the Board will handle business differently in the

future. Board members agreed that it made sense to give residents as much information as possible when asking them to sign any petition to fix the road. An estimate may be the only way to do so.

Walters moved and Duell seconded to allow Engineer Jennifer Hodges gather a pro bono estimate on an approximate cost for fixing Ridgeview Road.

# b. PD 2017-59 PRC Recommendation on Silver Lake Boat Launch No Wake Zone (7:11)

Deputy Planner Perdonik said that a resident asked about establishing a "no wake zone" in the vicinity of the Silver Lake Boat Launch. He has secured the support of neighboring residents. If approved by the Township Board, the proposal goes to the DNR for further research.

Schmuckal moved and Blood Law seconded to schedule a public hearing on August 8, 2017 for consideration of a Local Watercraft Control Ordinance.

## c. PD 2017-61 YMCA Lease agreement for Boardman River Property (7:14) Jay Buckmaster CEO of YMCA said they would like to renew the lease for three years. The YMCA would like to make improvements and then pursue at a much longer lease.

Walters moved and Schmuckal seconded to defer a decision on the YMCA Lease agreement until review of the original lease in its entirety can be reviewed by board members.

#### d. PD-2017-62 Runway 10 Avigation Easement (7:19)

Attorney Karrie Zeits with Smith Haughey representing the airport, discussed obstructions in the proposed easement. She said that an appraiser will determine the value of the small park now and then again after the avigation easement is completed. The difference between the two will be the good faith offer to the township. She added that the value of any replacement trees could be added into any offer. Zeits is asking for a person or persons to represent the township on the negotiations on the property.

Board members asked questions regarding the removal of the trees on the .21 acre parcel.

Duell moved and McManus seconded that the Supervisor, Dan Walters and Denise Schmuckal negotiate with the representatives of Cherry Capital Airport for tree removal and an avigation easement in "Park A" located in Gladewood Place Plat.

#### e. PD 2017-63 BVNP Construction Services (7:38)

Deputy Planner Perdonik said that bids for the project at the Boardman Valley Nature Preserve need to be broken up since they cannot get an affordable bid for the whole project at once. The project is now broken into phases and Gourdie Fraser will do the construction administration and Prein & Newhof will handle the bidding and coordinating with grantors and grantees. Overall there will be a cost savings of approximately \$4,000.

Agostinelli moved and McManus seconded to approve the Prein & Newhof proposal for \$8,300 for completion of the Boardman Valley Nature Preserve project.
