a. Commissioner Reports

Schmuckal reported that the BATA/TCHC project is ongoing.

b. Staff Report/Updates

Morton reported on each of the parks. At Silver Lake Recreation Area, he is working on crack seal bids and is proposing a third area for a dog park to let the grass rejuvenate. At the Commons Natural Area, he is working to keep graffiti and homeless camps at bay. At River East Recreation Area, electricity is hooked up to the barn and signage is being posted. Boardman Valley Nature Preserve looks good with the kayak launch installed and the parking lot being completed. At Miller Creek Nature Reserve, the Earth Day clean-up event was successful. Morton attended a meeting regarding the maintenance of Oleson's pond and is still working on the homeless encampment issues in all parks.

Schmuckal moved and Bukowski seconded to write a letter of appreciation to Norm Fred for his help in the clean-up of the parks.

Hannon said that the township is still awaiting the final documents from the state which deeds the Commons property back to the Township. The Grand Traverse County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority and staff have arranged a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment for the Commons area. Staff has prepared an Existing Conditions report for the Commons area which gives background on the site. Commissioners discussed the draft report. Staff has also prepared a draft RFP for Park Design services and hopes to issue the RFP in July. Discussion took place on the Commons property.

Bukowski moved and Spence seconded to recommend to the Township Board that as soon as the Commons 100 Property is secured from the State of Michigan, that the RFP be issued.

Purchased gate for well house enclosure.

Installing edging & rock border around well house enclosure.

Public Survey responses adding up on Website.

Need to replace countertop in Men's Bathroom.

Planning on resealing floors in bathrooms before Winter.

Commons

Cameras are up monitoring the kiosk near Greenspire & trail posts where graffiti has been occurring. New area near Cathedral Trail getting tagged. Staff covered it up & installed cameras.

Met with Planning Dept. on updates with deed restrictions & potential developer.

District & Staff removed a few down trees over trails.

Trail monitoring to deter camping. Nothing located in June.

Replaced missing trail map marker at Old Orchard Trail.

Walked problem areas with CPO's and found no new camps.

Mowing, trimming & pruning by Conservation District.

River East

Waiting on signs from Traverse City Staff to install on their parcel (#05-022-002-50). Camping still occurring. Violation letter sent.

Met with Jennifer Hodges & Elmer's on site for Phase 1.

Researched well information.

Electricity was hooked up back up to Templeton Barn. Panel installed.

- Still addressing the encampment issues spreading out from Goodwill Inn & City Property. Met with City & Goodwill Inn Staff addressing encampments.
- Harmless Reduction Staff came through week of July 20th to sweep for needles again.
- Took additional 25-30 bags of trash out of railroad area. Same individuals. Citations issued for littering.
- Conversations with our Staff & City Staff about the ongoing encampment issues.

Boardman Valley

Parking lot transformation almost complete. Waiting on concrete parking bollards.

Monitoring for encampments. Nothing to date found.

More boundary posts installed.

Posted & made contact later with two campers on Verizon Property. Both left and cleaned up their mess.

Miller Creek

District removed a few more down trees on trails.

Pruned back walking trails.

Contacted American Waste about trash pick-up schedule.

Installing more boundary & rules posts near problem areas.

Mowing, pruning & trimming on trails as needed. District has helped.

Moved along a camper near sign. Been warned numerous times. Cleaned up behind him.

Kid's Creek

Removed Chara (vegetation) and hauled over bank prior to fish stocking.

Harietta Hills could not get the hybrid bluegill. They did stock 100 rainbow trout.

Water temps have been around 60-64 degrees.


BACKGROUND:

Over the years, The Boardman River Clean-up Association has been a huge part of keeping the Boardman River & our Parklands clean and safe for recreational users. This organization has been led by **Norm Fred** and his countless volunteer groups. As of May 2021, the total trash removed was over 80,000 pounds. In order to properly recognize Norm Fred's efforts from the Charter Township of Garfield, our staff has suggested to name a stretch of trail in our River East Recreation Area after him.

BACKGROUND:

In October 2020, the Parks and Recreation Commission recommended to the Township Board a list of the priority parks projects for 2021. These projects formed the basis of the capital outlay portion of the parks budget which was eventually adopted as part of the overall 2021 Township budget. The following table indicates the status of these projects:

2022 PRIORITY PROJECTS:

At the June 7, 2021 meeting, Parks and Recreation Commissioners discussed the potential priority parks projects for 2022. Staff has included research and Commissioner feedback to compile a list of proposed projects for 2022 including the following:

Grand Traverse Commons Natural Area

The 2021 project list included the beginning of the Master Park Design Plan. Staff has worked on some tasks for this plan including an Existing Conditions Report and a draft RFP for consultant services, and a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment is also being prepared for the site. The Township anticipates the deed restriction removal process to be completed shortly, after which the RFP will be issued. This project will likely begin in late 2021 but continue into 2022. The \$75,000 includes \$50,000 of funds allocated in 2021 for the Master Park Design Plan.

Kids Creek Park

The 2021 project list included a solar aeration system for Oleson Pond, but upon further investigation the preferred project would dredge the pond instead and provide for restocking of fish. The \$15,000 includes \$6,000 allocated in 2021 for solar aeration. The Township would also seek additional grant funds to help complete this project.

River East Recreation Area

The next phase of improvements at River East Recreation Area is a 2022 priority project. The conceptual plan for River East shows a dog park area and restrooms being constructed in 2022.

Trails

The Township was recently made aware of an opportunity to apply for a project with the Michigan State University Urban and Regional Planning Program for students to complete a capstone planning project for a community client. Staff identified the Township Non-Motorized Plan as a potential project that would benefit both students and the Township.

FUTURE PROJECTS:

The Parks and Recreation Commission may also identify future projects beyond 2022 to keep on the radar for future years, allowing time to investigate the costs and feasibility of these projects.

ACTION REQUESTED:

The purpose of placing this item on the agenda is for the Parks and Recreation Commission to discuss the list of priority projects for 2022 and to make a recommendation to the Township Board as they begin their discussion on the overall Township budget for 2022. Following the discussion, if the Commissioners are comfortable with the list of proposed priority projects, then the following motion is suggested:
